1. PUBLIC COMMENT

2. ELECTION OF OFFICERS

3. MEETING MINUTES

The Board considered the August 18th, 2011 Regular Session Meeting Minutes. Charles McLaughlin asked if there were any changes needed.

Motion made by Mark Zielinski motioned to approve the minutes of August 18th, 2011 as amended to reflect that prior to entering Executive Session on the 18th, the Board reviewed the Executive Session checklist and that the appropriate declarations to enter Executive Session were made by the President and that the Board did not return to the open session meeting, seconded by S. Kitt Johnson, approved 9-0-1 with Steve Gavin abstaining as he was not present at the meeting.

Maggie Downey noted Executive Session minutes should reflect check list and special language as to the Purpose of the Executive Session.

4. TREASURERS REPORT

Mark Zielinski discussed the Cape & Vineyard Electric Cooperative, Inc. Income Statement for the period of July 1, 2011 through September 15, 2011 and the Balance Sheet as of September 15, 2011. Further, Mark explained the Revenue, Expenses and Tax figures and the current quarter money which is not realized yet due to timing (accounts payable).

Tim Twombly moved to approve the Treasurers Report, seconded by Charles McLaughlin, voted unanimously and approved 10-0-0.

5. OTHER COMMUNICATIONS FROM DIRECTORS

Maggie Downey discussed rulemaking on Net Metering. Key comments:

- a. The Department of Public Utilities should refine and clarify its interpretation of Section 18.02 to the extent that Interpretation would require one municipality or other governmental entity to use 100% of project output.
- b. The department should clarify the proposed regulation limiting the net metering capacity of municipalities and other governmental entities to 10 MW.
- c. The department should consider adding a definition of “other governmental entity” in its regulations.
- d. The department should clarify its reporting requirements.
- e. The department should clarify its Interpretation of “Per Unit” in Section 18-02 of its regulations.

Jeff Bernstein suggested a system should be established for assurance of net metering and how to determine an allocation of a cap. Jeff also would like a draft for potential legislation regarding the current issues and how to move forward with help from state officials and elected legislators.

Charles McLaughlin suggested a small subcommittee be established to discuss these issues with counsel’s help in preparation for the legislative level. Jeff Bernstein suggested possibly a conference call for the subcommittee.

At 10:53 a.m. Maggie Downey moved the Board to recess for a short break.

At 11:00 a.m. the Board reconvened from the break.

Other communication and general discussion continued:

- Steve Gavin stated the CVEC website needs updating.
- Maggie Downey announced there will be a hearing Monday, September 19, 2011 from 10:00 am to 4:00 pm at the Cape Cod Community College on Wind Energy sighting a Reform Act.
- Per Maggie Downey, Wednesday, September 21, 2011 CVEC and CLC will deliver a public presentation to the Assembly of Delegates at the Barnstable First District Court.
- CVEC Procurement Timeline for Round II PV RFP
- Jeff Bernstein drafted and prepared a public document which included:

- a) CLC Energy efficiency funds are accounted for and approved by DPU.
- b) Con Ed Solutions consented to CLC allocating its grant funds to CVEC.
- c) CLC dispersed funds to CVEC legally.
- d) CLC responded correctly to Open Meeting Law.
- e) Grants by CLC to CVEC were correct. CLC accounts for this purpose.

At 11:55 a.m. Upon Motion by Maggie Downey, seconded by Bill Straw, CVEC went into Executive Session upon the declaration of President Charles McLaughlin that the board hereby determines that the disclosure of trade secrets or confidential, competitively-sensitive or other proprietary information in an open session will adversely affect CVEC's ability to conduct business in relation to the other entities making, selling or distributing electric power and energy; and that the consideration of the purchase, exchange, lease or value of real property will have a detrimental effect on CVEC's negotiating position as a public body.
